٥		Add to your calendar all the pertinent dates and deadlines for each school on your list:  Application deadlines, Scholarship deadlines, Financial aid deadlines, etc.  Every school has a little page or section with "dates and deadlines" put all those on your calendar!  Make a spreadsheet to track your progress on applications for all schools  Name of school / Essays / Letters of Rec / Deadline / Decision mailed / etc.	
		Make documents that have all essay prompts for each school you're applying to (one document or folder of documents per school). Paste in all the prompts to each document so you're ready to write! Don't write these directly in the applications!! Spell check is your friend and you won't find it built into all the online apps (plus they are finicky and can delete your whole essay out; don't risk it!!)

٠	10. <b>Ensure your counselor has sent transcripts</b> to all schools you've applied to or check in with him/her to ensure that process is underway. Sometimes this is automatic. Just make sure.		
٠	11. Visit Colleges or learn more online to help you decide where you want to go.

٥	12. <b>Complete &amp; Submit your College Applications</b> (any early or fall deadlines or to any schools with scholarships or rolling admissions)
